Native Species of the Armidale Area

This list has been compiled to assist people of the Armidale area who wish to plant locally indigenous trees and shrubs. It was compiled by examining roadsides and properties within ten kilometres of Armidale.

Most of the native trees and shrubs have disappeared over much of the area, except for small remnants. Therefore, the list is not complete but with careful observations of existing remnants, and research into the natural distribution of various species, it will be extended.

Planting locally indigenous species has many advantages:

- They provide important habitat and ecological services;
- They maintain the landscape character;
- They provide many useful products;
- Neglect of our local species will lead to their gradual decline and loss.
